Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 4, 2025

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2025 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks long-term capital growth by investing primarily in exchange-traded funds to gain exposure to Canadian and foreign equity securities. The Fund may also invest in other mutual funds or in securities directly. The Fund diversifies in terms of geographic exposure, equity factor exposure, sector exposure, company market capitalization and investment style.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium-term investors looking for a managed asset portfolio fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock markets and who have a medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned 10.9% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 13.2% for a blended index composed of an 80.5% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index (returned 13.9%), a 10.5% weighting in the MSCI World Small Cap (Net) Index (returned 6.1%) and a 9% weighting in the S&P/TSX Composite Index (returned 15.8%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equity market performance was mixed over the period in response to shifting expectations regarding central bank monetary policy and geopolitical tensions. Rate cuts by the U.S. Federal Reserve and the European Central Bank helped investor sentiment in the United States and Europe. Currency movements generally boosted returns in Canadian dollar terms. Canadian equities rose despite volatility. Record-high gold prices supported mining stocks, while declining interest rates helped bank stocks. In response to weak economic data, the Bank of Canada reduced its policy rate seven times to 2.75% from 5.00%.

Within the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, Africa and the Middle East and Asia Pacific (ex Japan) were the best-performing regions in Canadian dollar terms, while Latin America and Japan were the weakest. The financials, utilities and communication services sectors were the strongest performers, while materials, health care and energy were the weakest.

Global small-capitalization stocks generally underperformed large-capitalization stocks. Within the MSCI World Small Cap (Net) Index, Africa and the Middle East and Japan were the best-performing regions in Canadian dollar terms, while North America and Asia Pacific (ex Japan) were the weakest. The financials, utilities and communication services sectors were the strongest performers, while energy, consumer discretionary and health care were the weakest.

Within the S&P/TSX Composite Index, materials, financials and information technology were the best-performing sectors, while health care, communication services and industrials were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index, with holdings in small-cap stocks detracting from performance. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund underperformed the blended index. The Fund's asset allocation detracted from performance, as did the selection of underlying exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") within each asset class.

Among the underlying ETFs in the portfolio, the largest detractors from relative performance were iShares Core S&P Small-Cap ETF, Mackenzie International Equity Index ETF and iShares Core MSCI Emerging Markets ETF (respectively representing 6.3%, 5.8% and 0.2% of net assets at period-end). The largest contributors to relative performance were Mackenzie US Large Cap Equity Index ETF, Mackenzie Global Equity ETF and Mackenzie Global Dividend ETF (respectively representing 46.4%, 16.8% and 4.9%).

The Fund's overall foreign currency exposure is actively managed to help mitigate risk and take advantage of opportunities. During the period, these currency activities detracted from performance.

Changes to the portfolio included new allocations to JPMorgan BetaBuilders Japan ETF, Mackenzie Global Dividend ETF, Mackenzie Global Equity ETF, Mackenzie International Equity ETF and Vanguard FTSE Europe ETF, and the elimination of the allocation to iShares Core S&P 500 ETF.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 582.3% during the period to \$27.4 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.7 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$22.7 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the year ended March 31, 2025, was generally similar to the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2024. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team maintains a negative outlook for global equities as they appear overvalued relative to company fundamentals. The U.S. equity market is more expensive than most markets, and the team believes it is likely to slow. In the team's opinion, investor sentiment has shifted against the United States in favour of more attractively priced international markets that offer more appealing risk-return opportunities. The team expects the United States to maintain tariff pressure on Canada throughout 2025 and believes the Canadian dollar is likely to weaken further.

The team expects U.S. economic developments – including government job cuts, trade conflicts and general uncertainty – to weigh on growth. At period-end, markets were expecting the U.S. Federal Reserve to cut the federal funds rate three more times in 2025.

The following changes to the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee occurred:

- effective September 13, 2023, Saijal Patel was appointed;
- effective March 5, 2024, Atul Tiwari resigned; and
- effective April 30, 2024, the terms for Robert Hines and George Hucal expired, and Rebecca Cowdery was appointed.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie and its affiliates may invest in the Fund. All these investments are made on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At March 31, 2025, funds managed by Mackenzie owned less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day. As a result of these investments, the Fund may be subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions.

At March 31, 2025, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.02 million in the Fund (0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

During the period, the Fund received \$0.02 million in income distributions from investments in exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") managed by Mackenzie to offset fees paid within those ETFs. There is no assurance that these distributions will continue in the future.

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

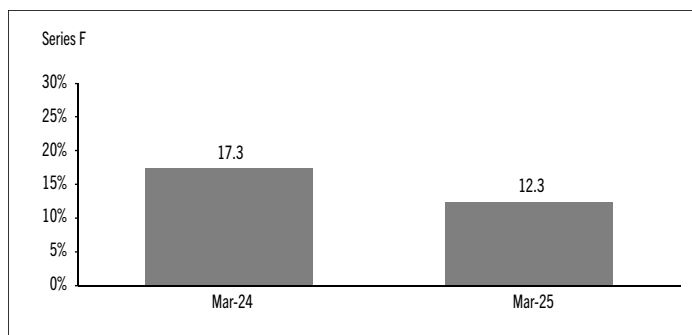
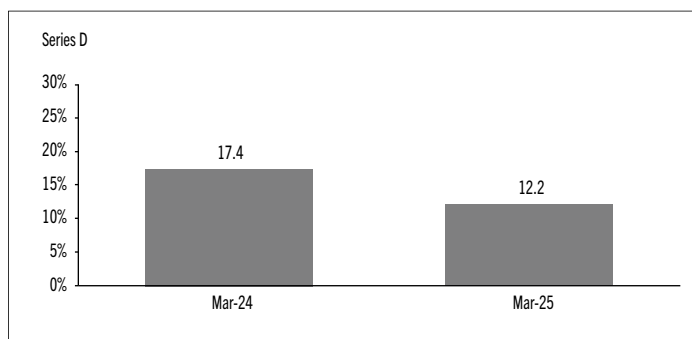
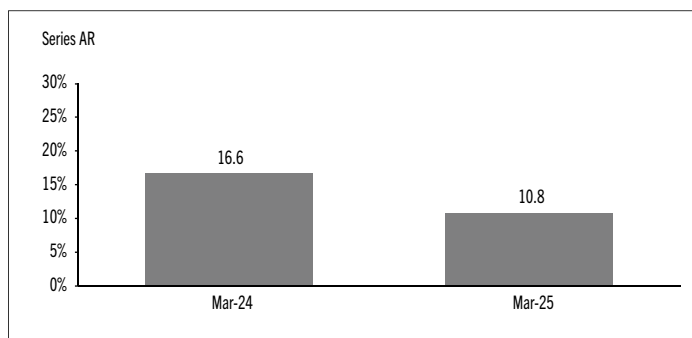
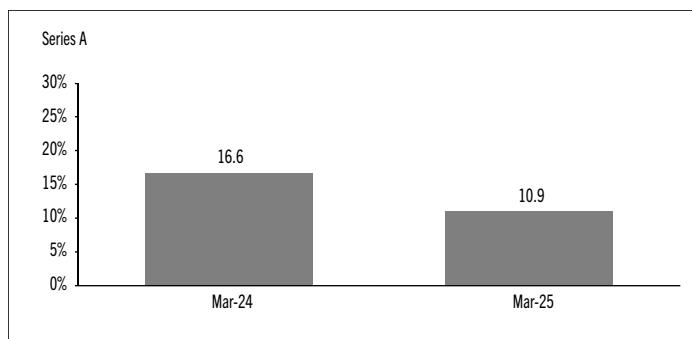
Past Performance

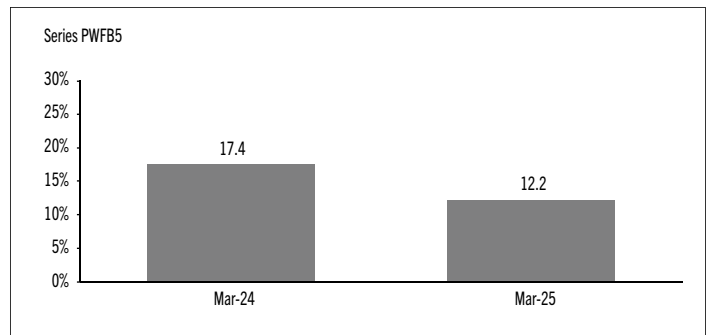
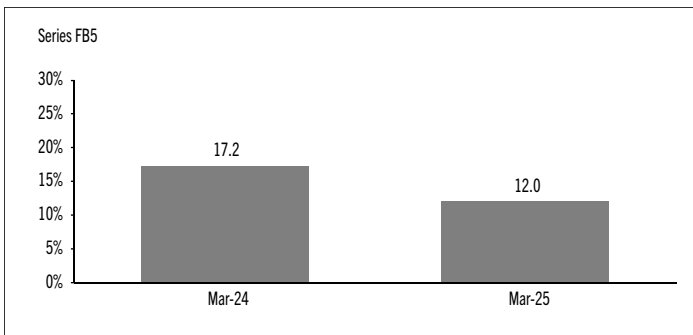
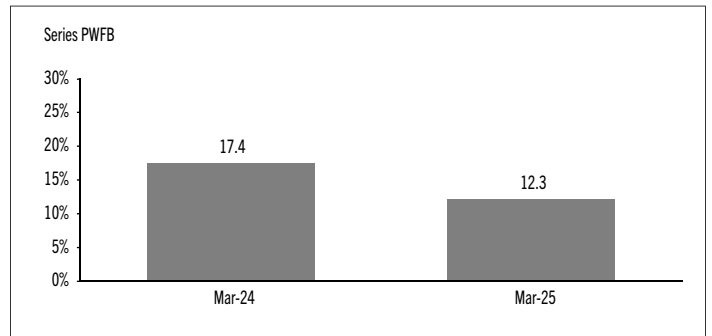
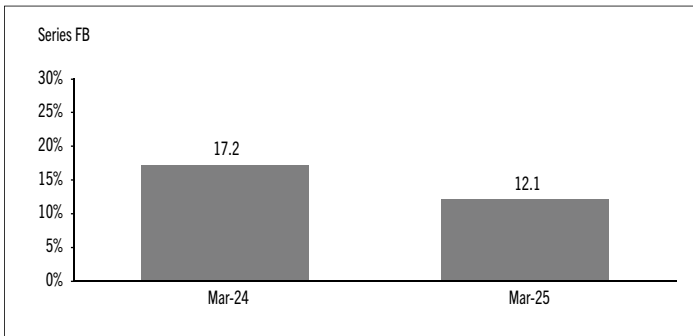
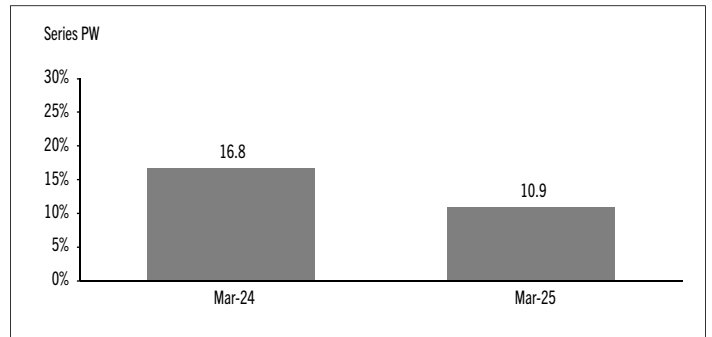
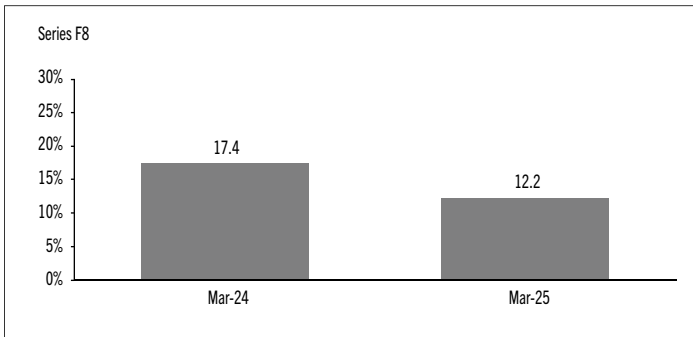
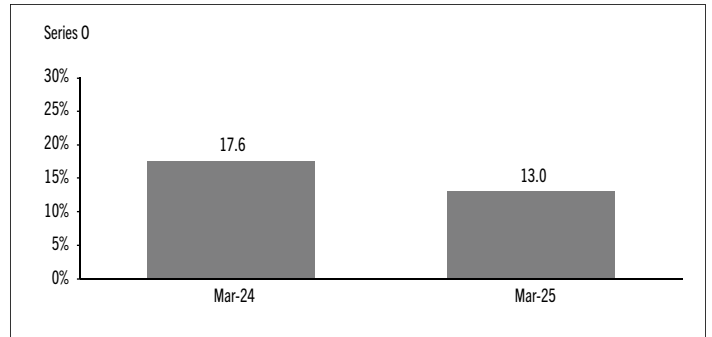
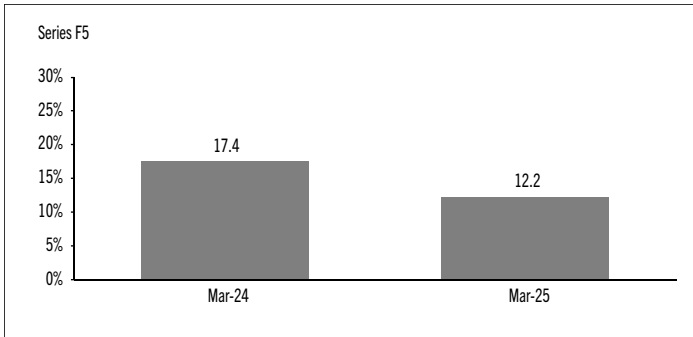
Year-by-Year Returns

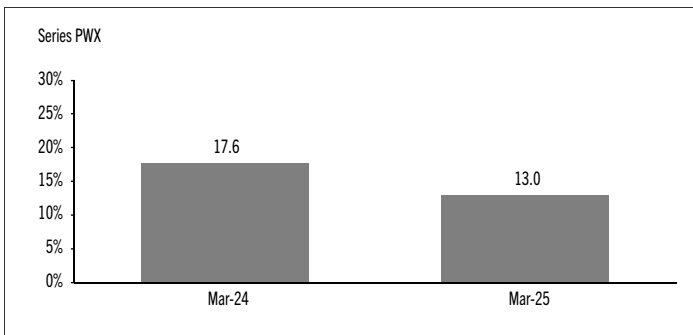
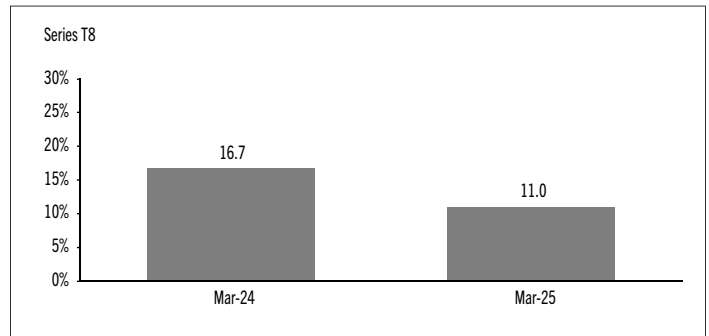
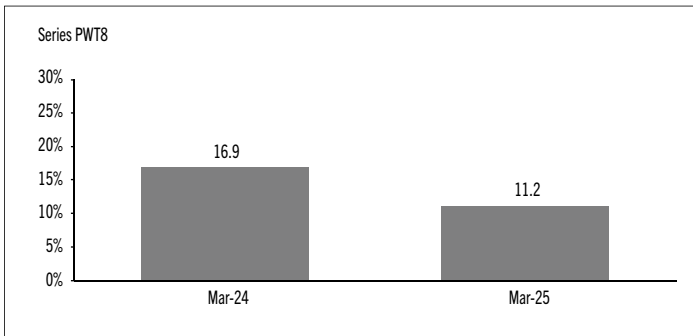
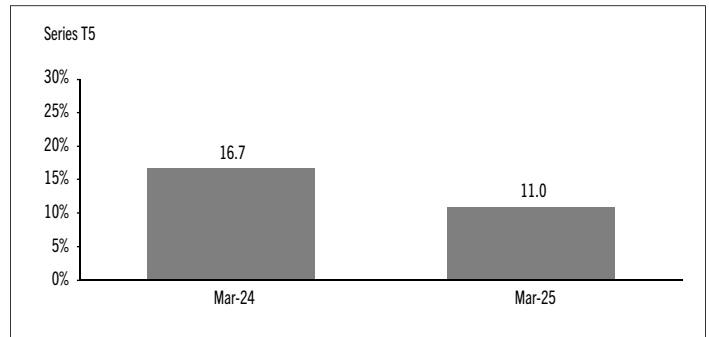
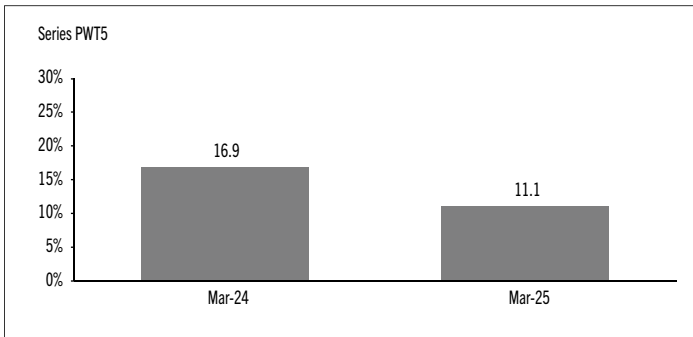
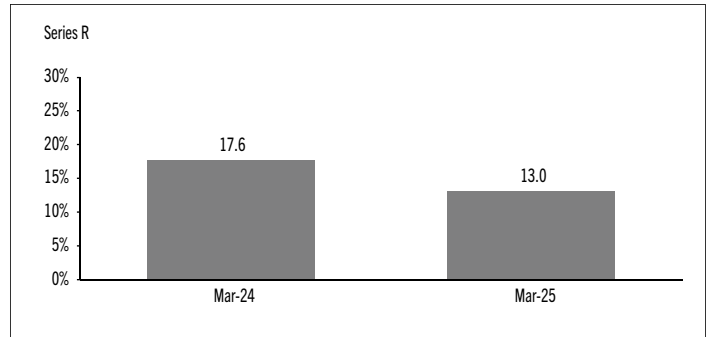
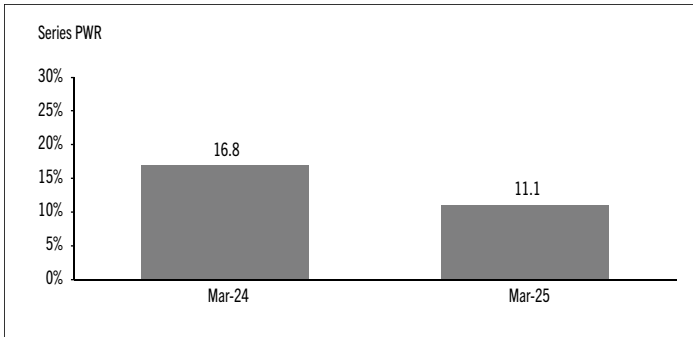
MACKENZIE ALL-EQUITY ETF PORTFOLIO

The S&P/TSX Composite Index is a capitalization weighted index that represents some of the largest float adjusted stocks trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange.

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: Investors Group Securities Inc. and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 33% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions paid for that series.

Series AR securities are offered to retail investors in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series D securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 through a discount brokerage or other account approved by Mackenzie.

Series F, Series F5 and Series F8 securities are offered to investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500 (\$5,000 for Series F5 and Series F8); they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie. Investors in Series F5 and Series F8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% or 8% per year, respectively.

Series FB and Series FB5 securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series FB5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who are enrolled in Mackenzie Portfolio Architecture Service or Open Architecture Service; retail investors investing a minimum of \$5 million, certain institutional investors; investors in a qualified group plan, and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries.

Series PW, Series PWT5 and Series PWT8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors in Series PWT5 and Series PWT8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% or 8% per year, respectively.

Series PWFB and Series PWFB5 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWFB5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series PWR securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000 in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series PWX securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series R securities are offered only to other funds managed by Mackenzie on a non-prospectus basis in connection with fund-of-fund arrangements.

An investor may purchase the Fund under a sales charge purchase option and a no-load purchase option. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund. The sales charge under the sales charge purchase option is negotiated by the investor with their dealer. Investors who previously purchased other Mackenzie funds under a redemption charge purchase option and low-load 3 purchase option (collectively the "deferred sales charge purchase options") may switch to securities of the Fund, under the same deferred sales charge purchase option, until such time as their redemption schedule has expired.
