Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 4, 2025

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2025 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Please read *A Note on Forward-Looking Statements* on the first page of this document.

Investors holding securities of Mackenzie Precious Metals Class were merged into the corresponding series of the Fund on a tax-deferred basis on July 30, 2021. Consequently the information in this report is presented as if the Fund had existed since the inception of Mackenzie Precious Metals Class.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks long-term capital growth by investing primarily in precious metals or in equities of precious metals companies located anywhere in the world.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for long-term investors looking for a precious metals sector fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock and metals markets, and who have a high tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned 60.9% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 13.7% for the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI World (Net) Index, and a return of 60.5% for the Fund's narrow index, the S&P/TSX Global Gold Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equity market performance was mixed over the period in response to shifting expectations regarding central bank monetary policy and geopolitical tensions. The materials sector was negatively affected by subdued commodities demand in China. Rate cuts by the U.S. Federal Reserve and the European Central Bank helped investor sentiment in the United States and Europe. Trade disputes, including concerns about U.S. tariffs, pressured global markets late in the period. Currency movements generally boosted returns in Canadian dollar terms.

Gold prices hit record highs during the period, supported by a number of factors. Central banks, particularly China's, continued to make significant purchases of bullion, and the appetite for "safe haven" investments grew amid uncertainty resulting from geopolitical tensions, global trade friction and newly introduced tariffs. Inflation on gold producers' operating costs slowed, supporting profit margins and share prices.

The Fund outperformed the broad-based index because of its overweight exposure to gold equities, which outperformed the broader market in the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund outperformed the narrow index, with stock selection in Canada and underweight exposure to the United States contributing to performance. In sub-industry terms, stock selection in gold and holdings in precious metals and minerals contributed to performance.

Conversely, holdings in the diversified metals and mining and in the silver sub-industries detracted from performance relative to the narrow index. In geographic terms, holdings in Australia and Belgium detracted from performance. The Fund's cash position detracted from performance as equity markets rose.

The Fund held call options on the price of gold, which is an efficient way to gain exposure to the commodity. These options contributed to performance as gold prices rose.

Over the period, the Fund's exposure to Canada increased, and exposure to the United States decreased, based on the portfolio management team's assessment of valuations and opportunities amid market volatility, and as a result of market movements.

Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Integration

ESG considerations contributed to the portfolio management team's decision to add a new position in First Quantum Minerals Ltd., an international copper and gold mining company. Since the forced suspension of mining operations at its major copper mine in Panama in late 2023, the company has made meaningful progress in addressing government concerns and has educated the country's population about the mine's social and economic contributions, while facilitating environmental audits. In addition, the company responsibly supports local communities, which the team visited as a part of ongoing due diligence in 2022. With the election of a new government in Panama in 2024, the team believes the probability of a favourable resolution for Cobre Panamá has improved.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 53.9% during the period to \$277.1 million. This change was composed primarily of \$106.2 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$9.0 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the year ended March 31, 2025, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2024. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes gold prices could continue to be supported by central bank bullion purchases and investor demand. Since China's central bank resumed buying bullion in November, it has continued to make significant purchases as it seeks to diversify foreign reserve holdings. The team expects increased investor interest in gold as a hedge against inflation, geopolitical risks and uncertainty arising from tariffs and trade conflicts. The team also believes that emerging market investors who are concerned about the gradual devaluation of local currencies are embracing gold for its capital preservation characteristics.

The following changes to the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee occurred:

- effective September 13, 2023, Saijal Patel was appointed;
- effective March 5, 2024, Atul Tiwari resigned; and
- effective April 30, 2024, the terms for Robert Hines and George Hucal expired, and Rebecca Cowderly was appointed.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

The Manager is wholly owned by IGM Financial Inc., which in turn is a subsidiary of Power Corp. of Canada. Companies related to Power Corp. of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of the Manager. At March 31, 2025, the Fund held the following investment(s) in companies affiliated with the Manager: \$0.3 million invested in securities issued by Umicore SA. The investment(s) represented 0.1% of the Fund's NAV. In making the investment(s), the Manager relied on the approval of the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee. The Independent Review Committee issued the approval on the basis that the investment(s) would be made in compliance with the Manager's policies. The Manager's policies are designed to ensure that any related party transaction (i) is made free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any considerations relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (ii) represents the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; and (iii) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie and its affiliates may invest in the Fund. All these investments are made on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At March 31, 2025, funds managed by Mackenzie owned 0.2% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day. As a result of these investments, the Fund may be subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions.

At March 31, 2025, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.01 million in the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

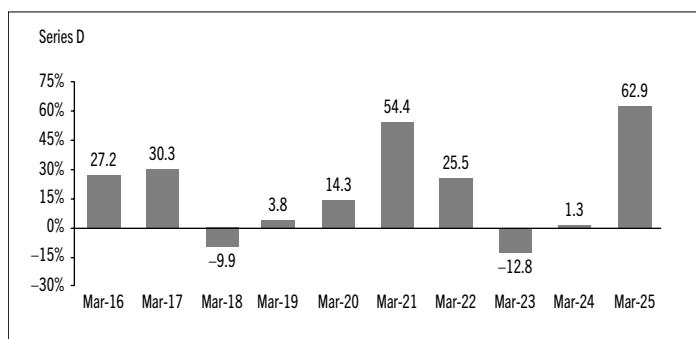

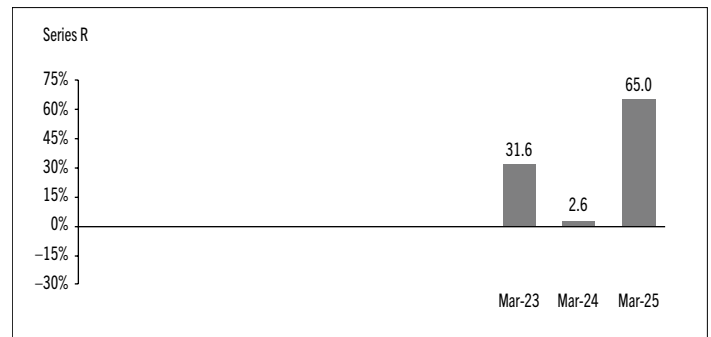
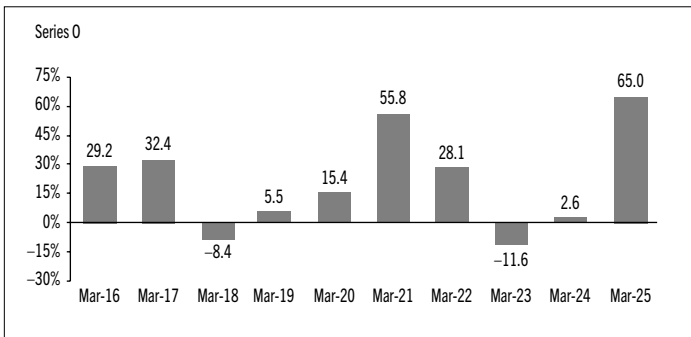
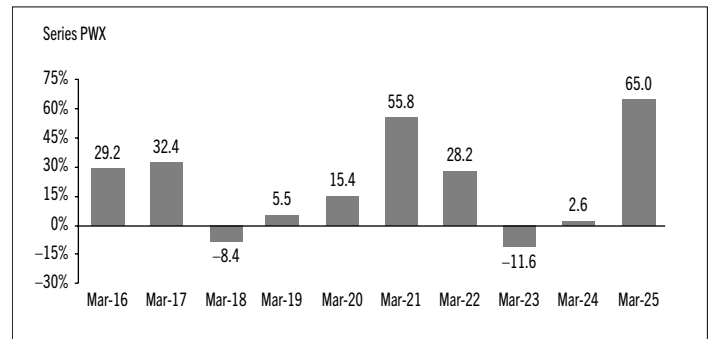
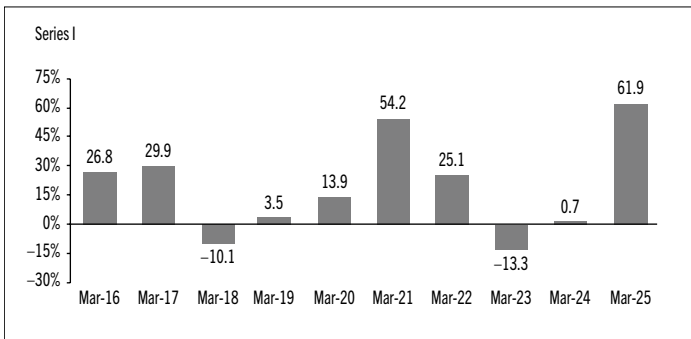
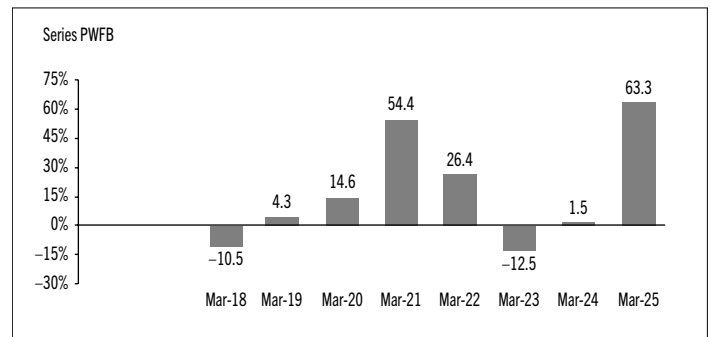
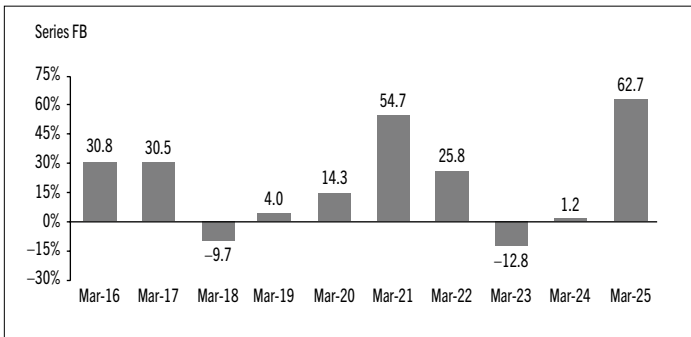
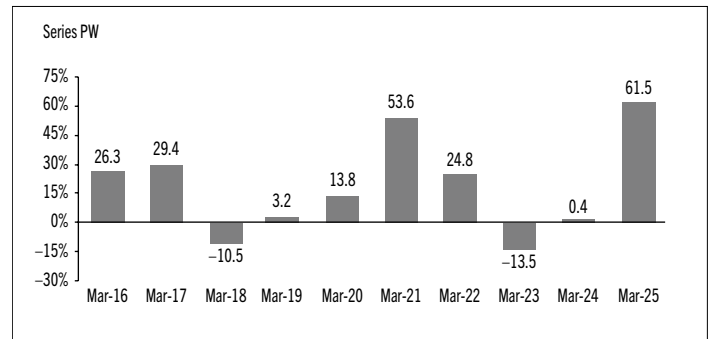
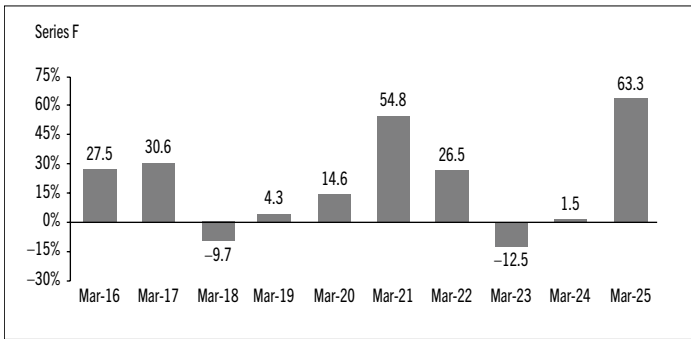
Year-by-Year Returns

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: Investors Group Securities Inc. and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 36% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions paid for that series.

Series A securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500.

Series F securities are offered to investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500; they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie.

Series FB securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who are enrolled in Mackenzie Portfolio Architecture Service or Open Architecture Service; retail investors investing a minimum of \$5 million, certain institutional investors; investors in a qualified group plan, and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries.

Series PW securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000.

Series PWFB securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series PWX securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series R securities are offered only to other funds managed by Mackenzie on a non-prospectus basis in connection with fund-of-fund arrangements.

Series I securities are no longer available for sale.

Effective June 1, 2022, an investor may purchase the Fund only under a sales charge purchase option. The sales charge under the sales charge purchase option is negotiated by the investor with their dealer. Securities purchased before June 1, 2022, under the redemption charge purchase option and low-load 3 purchase option (collectively the "deferred sales charge purchase options") may continue to be held in investor accounts. Investors may switch from securities of a Mackenzie fund previously purchased under these deferred sales charge purchase options to securities of other Mackenzie funds, under the same purchase option, until such time as the redemption schedule has expired.
