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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2025

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2025 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned 10.5% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 16.1% for the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, and a return of 10.8% for a blended index.* All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equities performed well over the period as shares of U.S. mega-capitalization companies involved in artificial intelligence ("AI") reached new highs. Continued AI investment, robust corporate earnings and a weakening U.S. dollar also supported global investor sentiment. Canadian equities advanced amid resilient commodity prices. Global fixed income markets reflected easing central bank monetary policy, slowing economic growth and moderating inflation. In September, the Bank of Canada reduced its policy rate by 25 basis points, to 2.50% from 2.75%.

Within the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, Latin America and Asia Pacific (ex Japan) were the best-performing regions in Canadian dollar terms, while Europe and Africa and the Middle East were the weakest. The information technology, communication services and industrials sectors were the strongest performers, while health care, energy and consumer staples were the weakest.

Within the S&P/TSX Composite Index, materials, information technology and financials were the best-performing sectors, while consumer staples, industrials and health care were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its allocation to fixed income, which underperformed equities in the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

* The blended index is composed of a 45% weighting in the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index (returned 16.1%), a 30% weighting in the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index (returned 0.9%), a 15% weighting in the S&P/TSX Composite Index (returned 22.1%) and a 10% weighting in the ICE BofA Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index (returned 1.9%).

The Fund underperformed the blended index. The Fund's asset allocation contributed to performance, while the selection of underlying exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") within each asset class detracted from performance.

Among the underlying ETFs in the portfolio, the largest detractors from relative performance were Mackenzie Global Dividend ETF, Mackenzie Global High Yield Fixed Income ETF and Mackenzie International Equity Index ETF (respectively representing 2.4%, 7.0% and 4.1% of net assets at period-end).

The largest contributors to relative performance were Mackenzie GQE Global Equity ETF, Mackenzie Canadian Strategic Fixed Income ETF and Mackenzie US Investment Grade Corporate Bond Index ETF (CAD-Hedged) (respectively representing 6.5%, 20.4% and 5.5%).

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 6.9% during the period to \$425.2 million. This change was composed primarily of \$41.5 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$13.9 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2025, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2025. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team's outlook for equities became positive in the period as global markets proved resilient, with improving corporate earnings and stronger investor sentiment. The team believes share valuations in Japan remain reasonable, and longer-term metrics suggest that developed international and emerging markets are more attractively valued than those in the United States and Canada.

The team believes policy uncertainty and slower global growth are likely to cap inflation. Because tariff-related price increases appear transitory, the team does not expect a lasting impact on fixed income investments. In Canada, the team believes softer economic data has increased the likelihood of additional Bank of Canada policy rate cuts. In the United States, a more accommodative tone from the U.S. Federal Reserve and mounting fiscal and debt concerns led markets to price in further interest rate cuts into 2026, which the team believes could pressure the U.S. dollar.

Effective May 29, 2025, the underlying fund Mackenzie Core Plus Canadian Fixed Income ETF was renamed Mackenzie Canadian Strategic Fixed Income ETF.

Effective July 29, 2025, the underlying fund Mackenzie Global Equity ETF was renamed Mackenzie GQE Global Equity ETF, and the underlying fund Mackenzie International Equity ETF was renamed Mackenzie GQE International Equity ETF.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

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Other Related Party Transactions

At September 30, 2025, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.01 million in the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

During the period, the Fund received \$0.6 million in income distributions from investments in ETFs managed by Mackenzie to offset fees paid within those ETFs. There is no assurance that these distributions will continue in the future.

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

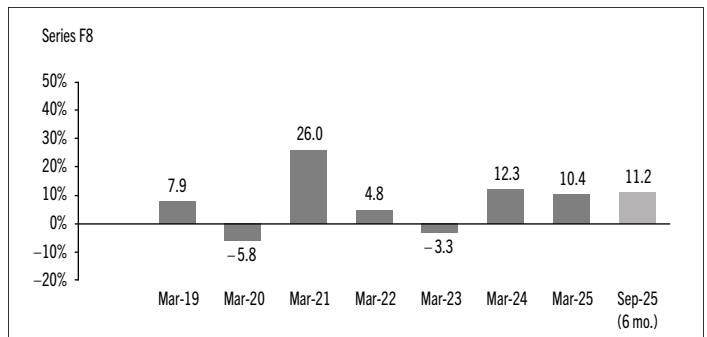
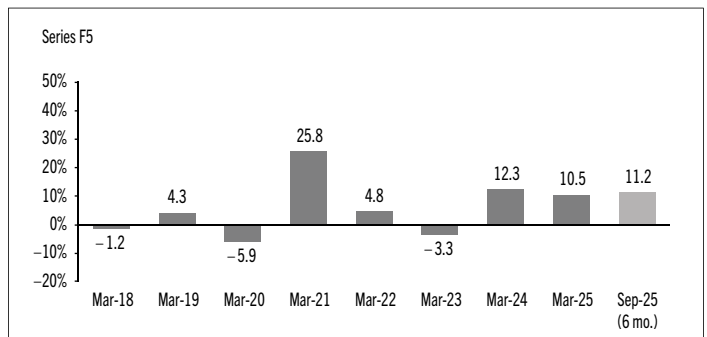
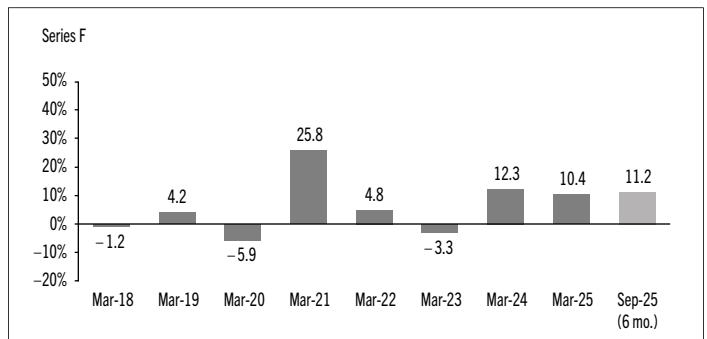
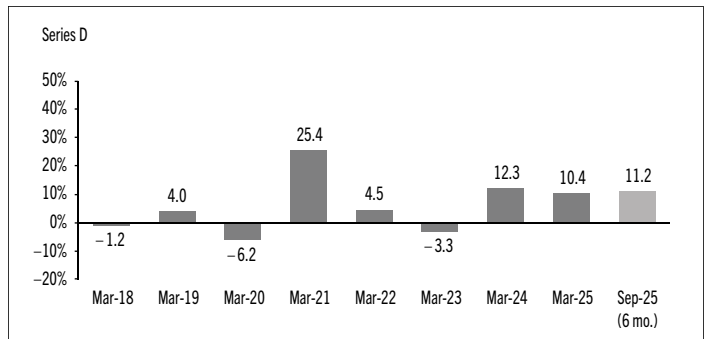
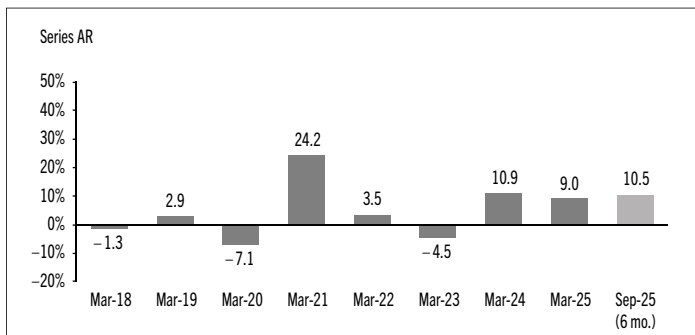
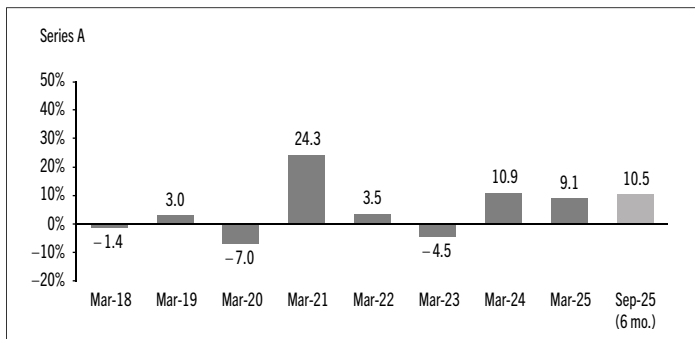
Past Performance

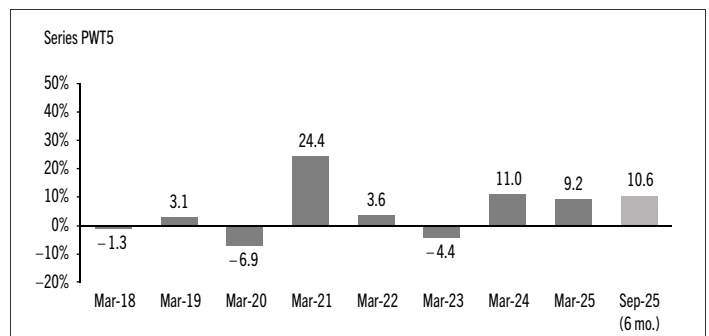
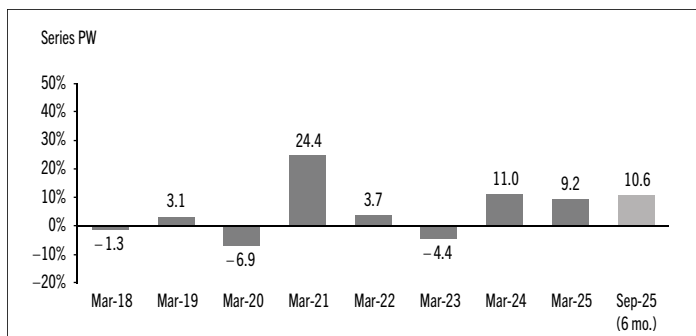
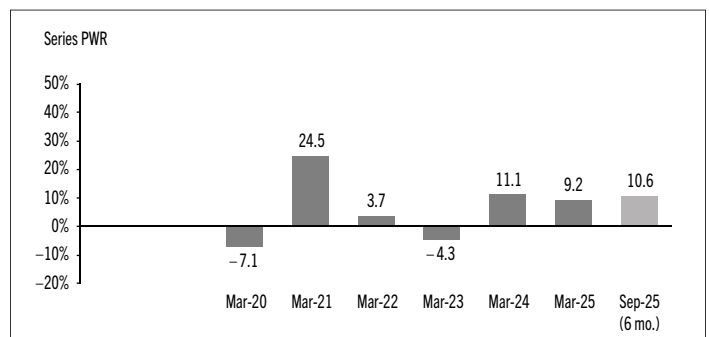
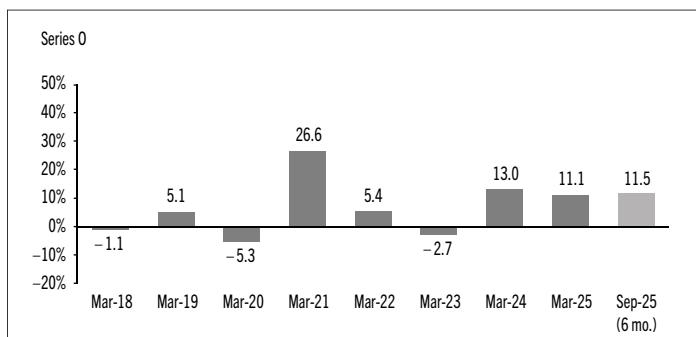
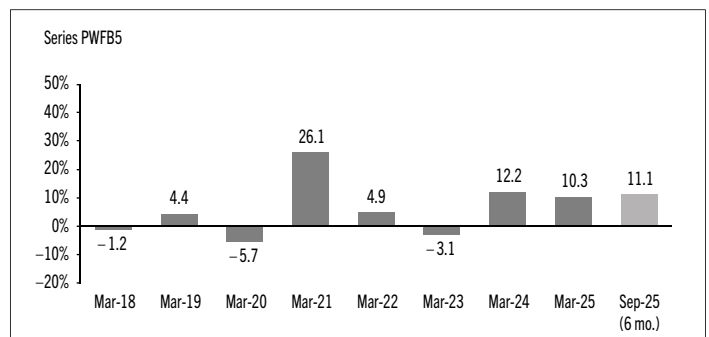
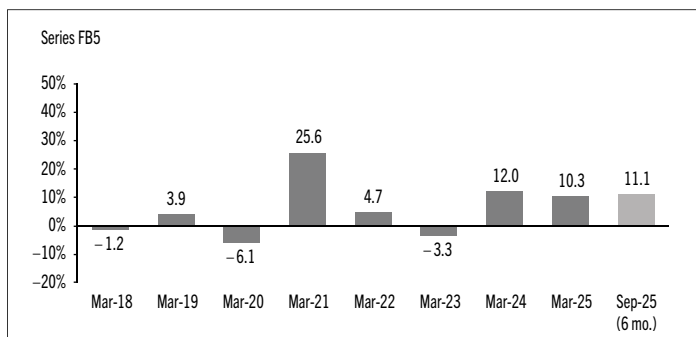
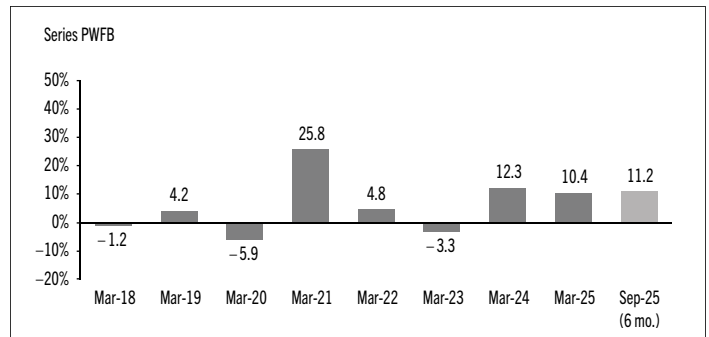
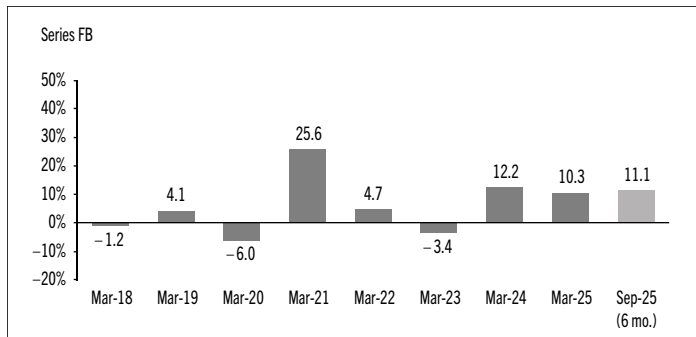
Year-by-Year Returns

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

IG Wealth Management Inc., a dealer affiliated with the Manager, may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers.

The Manager used approximately 41% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 50% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions paid for that series. The higher proportion of distribution-related payments is primarily attributable to the Fund's higher proportion of assets in series that pay a lower management fee compared to other funds managed by Mackenzie.

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Fund Formation and Series Information

The Fund may have undergone a number of changes, such as a reorganization or a change in manager, mandate or name. A history of the major changes affecting the Fund in the last 10 years can be found in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who are enrolled in Mackenzie Portfolio Architecture Service or Open Architecture Service; retail investors investing a minimum of \$5 million, certain institutional investors; investors in a qualified group plan, and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries.

Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Effective June 1, 2022, an investor may purchase the Fund only under a sales charge purchase option. The sales charge under the sales charge purchase option is negotiated by the investor with their dealer. Securities purchased before June 1, 2022, under the redemption charge purchase option may continue to be held in investor accounts. Investors may switch from securities of a Mackenzie fund previously purchased under the redemption charge purchase option to securities of other Mackenzie funds, under the redemption charge purchase option, until such time as the redemption schedule has expired.
