## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2025

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the ETF's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2025 (the "period"). If the ETF was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the ETF. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the ETF as calculated for subscription and redemption purposes, on which the discussion of ETF performance is based.

## Results of Operations

### Investment Performance

During the period, the ETF returned 13.8% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with a return of 22.1% for the ETF's broad-based index, the S&P/TSX Composite Index, and a return of 12.3% for the ETF's narrow index, the MSCI Canada Minimum Volatility Index. All index returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Canadian equities advanced over the period amid easing central bank monetary policy and resilient commodity prices. Gold prices surged to record levels, supporting mining stocks. New U.S. tariffs initially contributed to equity market uncertainty, but investor confidence firmed as the period progressed. In September, the Bank of Canada reduced its policy rate by 25 basis points, to 2.50% from 2.75%, in response to slowing economic growth and rising unemployment.

Within the MSCI Canada Minimum Volatility Index, materials, financials and real estate were the best-performing sectors, while information technology, industrials and consumer staples were the weakest.

The ETF underperformed the broad-based index, with stock selection in the information technology and financials sectors, as well as overweight exposure to the consumer staples sector, detracting from performance. Conversely, stock selection in the industrials sector contributed to performance relative to the broad-based index. Given the ETF's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison.

The ETF outperformed the narrow index, with stock selection in the materials and industrials sectors contributing to performance. Conversely, stock selection in the financials sector detracted from performance relative to the narrow index.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the ETF.

### Net Assets

The ETF's net assets increased by 22.0% during the period to \$116.4 million. This change was composed primarily of \$13.8 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$7.2 million due to net unitholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

## Recent Developments

The ETF rebalances and trades daily based on the portfolio management team's assessment of the return potential of individual stocks, including the impact of transaction costs. The team's quantitative, bottom-up stock selection process aims to add portfolio value in a variety of market conditions through investments in both growth- and value-oriented stocks and in mid- and large-capitalization stocks. As such, the team does not routinely generate market expectations and therefore rarely makes investment decisions according to macroeconomic forecasts.

Effective July 29, 2025, the ETF was renamed Mackenzie GQE Canada Low Volatility ETF.

## Related Party Transactions

### Management Fees

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for the ETF during the period ended September 30, 2025, was similar to the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2025. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in the ETF. The MERs are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The ETF paid management fees to the Manager at the annual rate of 0.45%.

The management fee for the ETF is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The ETF's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the ETF, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio and providing other services, and to pay for all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs as more fully described in the Prospectus) required to operate the ETF.

### Other Related Party Transactions

The Manager is wholly owned by IGM Financial Inc., which in turn is a subsidiary of Power Corp. of Canada. Companies related to Power Corp. of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of the Manager. At September 30, 2025, the ETF held the following investment(s) in companies affiliated with the Manager: \$2.7 million invested in securities issued by Great-West Lifeco Inc. and \$2.0 million invested in securities issued by Power Corp. of Canada. The investment(s) represented 4.0% of the ETF's NAV. In making the investment(s), the Manager relied on the approval of the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee. The Independent Review Committee issued the approval on the basis that the investment(s) would be made in compliance with the Manager's policies. The Manager's policies are designed to ensure that any related party transaction (i) is made free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any considerations relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (ii) represents the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the ETF; and (iii) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the ETF.

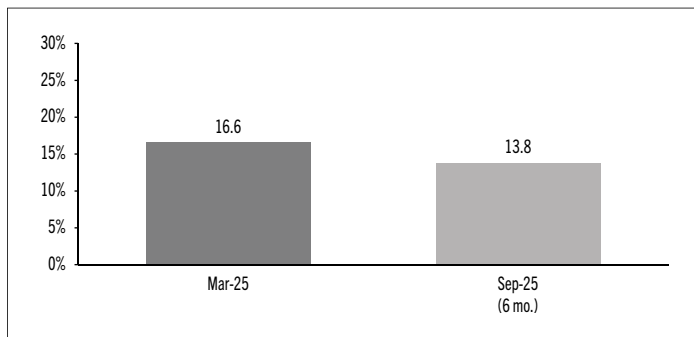
## Past Performance

(2) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, income taxes and withholding taxes, for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period, except as noted. If the ETF was established in the period, the MER is annualized from the date of inception to the end of the period. Where the ETF directly invests in securities of another fund (including other ETFs), the MER presented for the ETF includes the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.

(3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the ETF invests in securities of another fund (including other ETFs), the TER presented for the ETF includes the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. The Manager may reimburse the ETF for certain brokerage commissions and other transaction costs (including those payable to the custodian or its agents). The Manager may make these reimbursements at its discretion and stop these reimbursements at any time without notice.

(4) The ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the ETF in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the ETF. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the ETF is less than one year old.

(5) Closing market price, or the midpoint of the bid and ask prices in the absence of a closing market price, on the last trading day of the period as reported on the Toronto Stock Exchange.
